Nobel Prize Winners Reconsidered

When someone hears a scientist won a prize for discovering something, you might say something like õoh.ö If you looked closer, youød see some intriguing things about Nobel Prize winners.

Robert Lucas, the winner of the 1995 Nobel Prize in Economics, had to split his \$1 million prize with his ex-wife. They had divorced seven years before Lucas won, but their divorce settlement stated õWife shall receive 50% of any Nobel Prize.ö It expired on October 31, 1995, so had he won the year after, Lucas would have all the winnings for himself.

Next up is the highly rejected Lise Meitner. She took part in discovering nuclear fission, so wouldnot she get a prize for sure? The answer is no. It is rumored Meitner has been nominated 13 times for a Nobel Prize, but never won (no one is sure, since nominations are kept secret).

Kary Mullis, winner of the 1993 Nobel Prize in Chemistry, was supposed to be a witness in the O. J. Simpson murder trial. Simpsonø lawyer felt the prosecutionø DNA case was already destroyed and didnø want Mullisø personal life to distract jurors.

Believe it or not, there are some people who actually declined to receive Nobel Prizes. One is Le Duc Tho, who brokered a Vietnam cease fire. He declined the 1973 Nobel Piece Prize because there isnøt exactly peace in Vietnam. Another is Jean Paul Sartre, who was awarded 1964 Nobel Prize in Literature. He waved it off because õlt is not the same thing if I sign Jean-Paul Sartre or if I sign Jean-Paul Sartre, Nobel Prize winner. A writer must refuse to allow himself to be transformed into an institution, even if it takes place in the most honorable form.ö

There are also some disrespected people who have won a Nobel Prize. Daiel Carleton Gajdusek, who won in 1976 for research in human slow-virus infections, was put in jail for 19 months on charges of child molestation in 1997. Johannes Fibiger won in 1926 for discovering parasitic worms cause cancer, but it was actually false. Yasser Arafat shared the 1994 Nobel Peace Prize with Shimon Peres and Yitzhak Rabin, which caused Nobel committee member Kare Kristiansen to resign and say, õWhat consequences will result when a terrorist with such a background is awarded the world¢ most prestigious prize?ö

Alfred Nobel ô inventor of dynamite and founder of the Nobel Prize ô may have had the idea to create the award after a premature obituary in a French newspaper called him a õmerchant of death.ö If youøve ever wondered how much control Nobel had in the prize, itø clearly stated in his will. It says to give prizes to the hard working people who affect the world in the most positive way in physics, chemistry, medicine, literature, and peace. His will explains who will give out the awards. To choose the winner for the peace prize, there will be a committee of five people elected by the Norwegian Storting.

Winter Safety Tips

Winter is approaching and many of us will be traveling. There is more to surviving winter than taking your car to the mechanic for a checkup. Here are some winter safety tips to keep you safe while traveling this winter.

Always have a winter survival kit in your car. The kit should include these basic items: drinking water, high-calorie foods like candy bars, blankets or sleeping bags, some extra clothes for warmth, a pocketknife, flashlight, spare batteries, matches or small candles so you can melt snow to drink, and a nylon cord so that if someone has to get out of the vehicle in a blizzard he can find his way back. Here are some other things to keep in your trunk: a shovel, fire extinguisher, and basic tools.

Before you even leave the driveway, make sure to clean all the snow and ice off your windows. Better yet, make sure your tires are good and also have an extra jug of antifreeze in the car. When stopping on ice, just press the brakes a little instead of slamming on the brakes. Always watch out for ice even if it looks like there is no ice. Reduce your speed to help prevent accidents and make sure you have enough stopping time between you and the car in front of you. Don¢t use cruise control or overdrive on icy roads. Always slow down when you see shady spots because you can encounter õblack ice,ö which is really dangerous.

Make sure you have a full tank of gas and only let it go down to about half a tank, and then stop to fill it up. Turn on your lights so you can see other drivers and other drivers can see you. Dong assume your vehicle can handle all conditions. If you get stuck, do not spin your tires because that only digs you deeper. Also, try rocking your vehicle or turning your tires to push snow out of the way so you can get unstuck. Dong pass snow plows or sanding trucks, the drivers have limited visibility. Use low gears to keep traction.

Hope you follow these safety tips when traveling. Stay safe and have a fun, relaxing holiday.

What advice would you give other vocalists? Take the time you have to learn from Mrs. Carpenter. Sheøs amazing!


