

The *US News and World Report* has ranked the Badger High School as one of the best high schools in the nation and state of Minnesota! The *US News and World Report* released its 2017 report detailing the best high schools in the nation and the state on April 25. Badger High School was recognized as one of the Best High Schools in the state of Minnesota and the United States. To be recognized as one of the best is truly an honor for our district. To determine which schools deserved designation as being one of the "Best" high schools in the nation and our state, *US News and World Report* focused on the following four areas:

- 1) Did students perform better than expected in their state evaluation of reading and math results for students on state proficiency tests?
- 2) Did disadvantaged students (minorities and low-income) perform better than state average when comparing math and reading proficiency rates?
- 3) Did student graduation rates meet or exceed a national standard?
- 4) Are students prepared for college-level coursework?

US News and World Report analyzed 769 high schools in the state of Minnesota. 158 schools were recognized. Our district received a bronze ranking and is recognized both nationally and at the State level. Congratulations to all of students, staff members, school board, and district residents. While our school district continues to seek methods to improve teaching and learning, we truly have much to be proud of! #### **Ingredients:**

2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup cocoa powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 cup softened butter

3/4 cup white sugar

3/4 cup packed brown sugar

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Whisk together the flour, cocoa powder, and baking soda.
- 3. Beat the butter, white sugar, and brown sugar with an electric mixer in a large bowl until smooth. Beat in one egg until completely incorporated. Beat in the last egg along with the vanilla. Mix in the flour mixture until just incorporated. Fold in the chocolate chips; mixing just enough to evenly combine. Drop by heaped teaspoonful onto ungreased baking sheets.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven until the edges are golden, 9 to 12 minutes.
- 5. Allow the cookies to cool on the baking sheet for 1 minute before removing to a wire rack to cool completely.
