



Dear 4-H Senior,

Believe it or not, graduation is just around the corner. You are probably starting to make some plans for your future education. Deciding what school to attend (and how to pay for it) can be a challenge. Here is where your years of 4-H involvement can pay off.

Enclosed is information on the 4-H Scholarship program. High school seniors who are currently enrolled in 4-H are eligible to apply for a \$250 scholarship. This scholarship will be presented at graduation ceremonies or award programs and is payable after having completed one semester of any type of higher education program.

There will be up to four scholarships awarded. The scholarships are for advanced training which may include vocational school, a two year or four year college or university.

The committee selecting the recipients will base its selection on the requirements listed on the enclosed information sheet. Please read this sheet carefully and take note of what is required.

The completed application, reference letters, and written essay are all due in the Extension-4-H Office by **April 1st**.

ROSEAU COUNTY 4-H SCHOLARSHIP

PURPOSE:

Scholarships will be presented to 4-H members in the Roseau County 4-H program who are enrolling as college freshmen in the current year.

The scholarships are for 4-H members who have a desire to continue their educational training and have been contributing members of the Roseau County 4-H program for at minimum of 1 full 4-H year.

1. The scholarships will be presented at graduation ceremonies or awards programs in the schools represented.
2. The scholarships are being presented by the Roseau County 4-H Leaders Council.
3. The scholarships will be issued after one semester of school, depending on the course arrangement of the school, providing grades are a high C or better. This is in accordance with the policy of most schools.
4. A committee of the 4-H Program Coordinator or Regional Educator, an officer of the 4-H Leader's Council, and one 4-H leader from each of the school areas will go over the applications and make the selections. Names of the applicants will not be available to the review committee, only their application information. Committee members cannot be parents of the applicants.
5. Applications are available on the Roseau County 4-H website, from the Roseau County Extension Office or your school counselor.

REQUIREMENTS:

Applications must be in the county extension-4-H office by **April 1** of the current year.

Applicants need to submit:

- Completed application form
- Two letters of recommendation. One letter must be from a 4-H leader, non-parent.
- A written statement by the applicant on,
“How have you applied the four H’s in your life?”
